- During his tenure as superintendent, San José Unified was recognized by the Editorial Projects in Washington D.C. for having the second highest graduation rate in the nation for urban school districts among the nation's 50 largest cities. The graduation rate for seniors was 93%.
- Previously, Mr. Iglesias served as an elementary and secondary teacher, principal, director of curriculum, and assistant superintendent of instruction.
- Mr. Iglesias has experience conducting executive searches since 2010, and has facilitated or assisted in the facilitation of more than 30 executive searches since that time.
- Mr. Iglesias was state president of the Association of California School Administrators (ACSA), representing over 16,000 members statewide.
- Mr. Iglesias received his bachelors degree from the University of California, Berkeley and his masters degree in multicultural education from the University of Southern California.
